# Space Toilet

Robin Levien RDI is not a household name but his designs are. Famous for his work for tableware and bathroom companies, his 1999 Space toilet won a prestigious D&AD Silver Award. It was recognition for decades of innovative designs and their enduring success in the market.

The Space range is the result of Levien's longstanding partnership with Ideal Standard, a company with an on-going commitment to modern design within the bathroom industry. It was commissioned to address the problem of increasingly smaller bathroom sizes and it was the first range to seriously address this problem.

Research is a key element of Levien's approach and the Space project brought together a large team including architect Isobel

Coomber. Sources included consumers and builders who were asked to supply the dimensions of real bathrooms; some of the smallest and most awkward ones were recreated with moveable plywood walls in a large room that was christened the "Space Lab". Hand-sculpted blue foam models of all the concepts for the range were evaluated in the Space Lab and ideas which made the maximum use of the limited available space were developed. The most innovative of these is the Space toilet, which is round in plan and has a seat that can be fitted in three positions, straight or angled at 45° to the left or right. This simple idea means the toilet can be installed close to a wall, so freeing up space for a washbasin or even enabling a door to open.
